## **General Information**

No other part of the world is so richly embellished in history, culture, and spectacular scenery as in Europe. Your cruise vacation will take you to some of the most exciting ports in Europe. The days ashore present an invitation to adventure, education, and enjoyment. Organized Shore Excursions give you the opportunity to explore the many fascinating places you will want to see. To ensure the best possible sightseeing, Celebrity Cruises has planned a varied program of excursions ranging from simple to sophisticated, in tune with existing conditions in each port. These excursions are arranged and operated by independent agencies, with experienced guides to escort you. This brochure lists the descriptions of the available Shore Excursions at each port of call. Most Shore Excursions may be purchased in advance. Certain excursions are limited in the total number of participants; therefore, for your convenience, we recommend you advance purchase. Also, please note that all tour duration times are approximate and can change without prior notice.

When should I reserve my Shore Excursions?

This brochure contains brief descriptions of tours available. Please book your excursions as soon as possible since some shore excursions can accommodate only a limited number of participants. Tours are sold on a first-come, first serve basis and we recommend that you purchase them in advance of your cruise in order to avoid disappointment. On board, you may purchase tours through the interactive TV system in your stateroom (if available), by booking form dropped at the excursion desk or directly at the Shore Excursion Office during the hours advertised in the ships daily program. NOTE: Not all destinations offer accessible shore excursions

How can I book shore excursions in advance via the Internet?

You can purchase your shore excursions online by visiting our website, <a href="www.celebrity.com">www.celebrity.com</a> at any time. To pre-book an excursion, you will need your cruise reservation number (obtained from your travel agent or reservation agent), ship name, and sailing date. Once you have completed your purchase, an immediate recap of the selected tours will be provided along with a final e-mail confirmation when your credit card purchase is approved. Your purchased tour ticket(s) will be delivered to you in your cabin. Kindly note that you have up to 4 days prior to your sail date to purchase your shore excursions online. Once within the 4-day sail date deadline, the booking system is closed and tours are no longer available for pre-booking. From this point, all guests must book their excursions on board the vessel on a first-come, first-serve basis. Your stateroom attendant will deliver your purchased ticket(s) to your cabin on the evening of embarkation. If you do not receive your tickets in your stateroom, please inquire at the Shore Excursion Office as soon as possible.

What is a Tender Port of Call?

There are some ports where the ship remains at anchor. Either the ship's boats (tenders) or local boats will be used to transport you back and forth between the ship and shore. Tender ports are indicated on the itinerary pages.

What do Shore Excursions include?

Shore Excursions include transportation according to the itinerary, meals, refreshments, guides, and entrance fees as indicated. Fares for Shore Excursions are subject to change without notice. All prices quoted are based on tariffs and exchange rates current at the time of printing, and are subject to increase with or without previous notice consequent upon any increase in the basic tariff and/or exchange fluctuations, which may accrue prior to commencement of the tours.

Prices of shore excursions are quoted per person and generally include available local transportation, ranging from coaches, taxis, limousines, and boats. Meals and local taxes are included where specified. Where tours are operated by car, 2 to 3 persons are allocated to each vehicle. Prices do not include any expenses incurred in returning to the ship should it be elected to leave the group before the tour is completed.

When and where do Shore Excursions depart?



Most tours will meet in a lounge on board the ship prior to departing. When the ship is at anchor, staff will be on hand to assist you to the departure point.

Timings have been established according to information received from the local tour operators but are subject to alterations should the vessels arrival time at the port be delayed or circumstances arise whereby the itinerary for a particular excursion must, necessarily, be amended. Guests should be mindful of the fact that at ports where the ship lies at anchor, the afternoon excursions commence from the dockside, not the ship. Guests should, therefore, allow at least 30 minutes for the tender ride to shore.

When booking more than one tour in a day, please allow at least 60 minutes between the return of the first tour and the departure of the second tour.

Tour departure times may vary from those listed on the order form, especially in ports where the ship must tender guests ashore. Please check your tour tickets for the time and location of departure. No announcements for the tours will be made on board the ship.

Is it possible to miss the Ship?

All guests are required to be back aboard ship no later than 30 minutes prior to the scheduled departure time, which is listed in the Daily Program and posted at the gangway. The scheduling of all Shore Excursions conforms to this requirement. If you leave a tour en route; however, it will be your responsibility to secure transportation and return to the pier on time. If for any reason a ships excursion is delayed, the ship will be notified and await the tours return.

What type of transportation is used for Shore Excursions?

Standards of transport vary considerably; however, Shore Excursions utilize the best quality transportation possible in each port. Air-conditioned vehicles are not always available nor do all tour buses have restroom facilities on board. Please note that some countries have local restrictions and/or zoning laws that prohibit the use of the on board facilities and prohibit the idling of engines while parked at the various venues. The air-conditioning systems may not be to North American standards. Please also bear in mind that cars, taxis or mini-buses may be used in some ports where coaches are not available or are limited.

What if I wish to take the same coach as my family or friends?

Guests wishing to travel with friends should proceed to the point of departure as indicated on your shore excursion tickets, as this will help the tour staff to allocate space in the same vehicle.

What if I wish to tour on my own?

Guests who do not join these prearranged shore excursions must, therefore, rely on whatever transportation equipment might be available, and they are advised that the drivers are not under supervision. Such drivers may not be informed of the sailing hour of the ship and it is not certain that they will follow routes that are more desirable. In addition, considering the limited transportation facilities in some ports, relief cars may not be obtainable in case of breakdowns along the road. Tours are the best way of seeing the country during a stay at a cruise port of call and they have been arranged so the guests see as much of interest as possible.

Will I have time to shop?

Whenever possible, shopping time has been allocated within the framework of the excursions. However, tours are not designed for shopping and time is limited.

How do I pay for Shore Excursions on board?

The only way to pay for Shore Excursions on board is through your shipboard credit system for which you sign up after boarding the ship.

\*Children's tickets are available on some tours for guests aged 4 years to 12 years (inclusive). Guests aged 13 and over will be



charged the adult price. A parent or guardian must accompany guests under 18 years of age. Infants 3 years and under will be carried free of charge, subject to them not occupying a seat.

Prices included herein are subject to change at any time and may vary by sailing. We suggest booking your excursions at <a href="https://www.celebrity.com">www.celebrity.com</a> for current prices.

How strenuous are the Shore Excursions in each port of call?

Most of the cities you will be visiting during your cruise vacation were built without regard for the modern conveniences and freedoms we may take for granted today. They offer quaint, narrow, cobblestone streets, and large bustling walkways that have been in existence long before the advent of motorized transportation. To preserve their antiquity, many cities and old towns are pedestrian-only, and may not be conveniently accessible for guests with mobility impairments. All of the Shore Excursions require some degree of mild, moderate, or strenuous walking. Likewise, venues that have grand entryways, multiple stories, and sprawling gardens, make stair-climbing a necessity. To assist our guests, we have rated each Shore Excursion within this brochure by the amount of walking and stair climbing needed to fully participate in the excursion as indicated by the tour description.

The Shore Excursions presented in this brochure require the guests to use a coach or other forms of transfer which will require you to step up 2 to 3 steps, approximately 10 inches high each. Most (but not all) coaches used can accommodate collapsible wheelchairs to be stored in the luggage compartment underneath the coach. However, it should be noted that escorts, drivers, guides, and shipboard staff are not obliged to lift guests into the vehicles. Lift-vans and/or coaches are not available in all ports of call. Tendering may preclude guests in wheelchairs from going ashore at certain ports of call. For tendering procedures, guests with special needs should contact our Access department at <a href="mailto:special\_needs@rccl.com">special\_needs@rccl.com</a> or by calling (866)592-7225. Due to the various celebrations taking place during the year, kindly note that certain circumstances may arise where the tour content or itinerary may have to be altered without prior notice. This is beyond the control of either the local tour operator or Celebrity Cruises Inc.

Please note there are certain excursions that for safety reasons, age, weight, and/or height restrictions apply. The individual vendors impose these restrictions and Celebrity Cruises must comply accordingly.

Guests wishing activity type tours (i.e. biking, kayaking, hiking, etc.) should be in excellent health and make themselves aware of the physical, age, and fitness requirements before making a value judgment as to whether or not to participate. Any guest with limitations, who are pregnant, who have had recent surgery, or are taking prescription drugs, should check with the excursion office before booking any activity type tours.

By booking the excursion, you are also confirming that you and your party are in good physical and mental condition and have no history of seizures, dizziness, fainting, heart conditions or respiratory problems. You also confirm that no one is taking medicine that carries a warning about impairment of physical or mental abilities.

For the comfort of all our guests, smoking is not permitted aboard any sightseeing vehicle or transport. Kindly note the below symbols act only as a guideline and guests must make their own judgment regarding participating in tours. Guest accepts that Celebrity Cruises Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "Celebrity") acts as agent only for passengers and has no responsibility for the performance of the Shore Excursions herein specified.

- 2. Celebrity undertakes to use its best endeavor to ensure that a Shore Excursion is performed as advertised. However, the Passenger accepts that in certain circumstances and for reasons beyond the control of Celebrity of whatsoever kind or nature it may be impractical, unwise, or impossible for the Shore Excursion to be performed. The decision to abandon or withdraw any Shore Excursion is to be taken at the sole discretion of Celebrity but always taking into account the safety and convenience of the passenger.
- 3. Shore excursions are subject to cancellation or modification, depending on the number of guests participating. In the event of a tour cancellation or modification, advance notice will be given by shipboard personnel. Certain tours have a minimum booking requirement, or must be limited to a maximum number of participants.
- 4. The itineraries are expected by Celebrity to be as advertised, but Celebrity reserves the right to change such itineraries or to omit any place or places or to alter the advertised sequence of the excursion in accordance with the conditions and circumstances



prevailing at the time of the excursion with or without previous notice. Any such change, omission, or alteration made by Celebrity shall be made at their sole discretion but always bearing in mind the safety, convenience and/or best interests of the passenger.

- 5. Passengers are advised to leave their baggage and all items of value on board the vessel. Celebrity accepts no responsibility for any loss of, or damage to, any such baggage, or item of value occurring during or relative to the Shore Excursion(s) specified on the face hereof.
- 6. Celebrity is committed to local operators in respect of reservations made. Celebrity hereof must therefore receive notice of any cancellation before the closing date and hour of the Shore Excursion(s) published, failing which a refund can only be made in the event of the ticket being resold.

In the event, however, of the Shore Excursion(s) having to be canceled in accordance with Clause 2 hereof or for any other reason, Celebrity will refund in full the monies paid and upon tendering such refund to passengers, Celebrity shall be free of all liability in respect thereof.

In selling tickets, coupons or vouchers or making arrangements for shore excursions, the Carrier acts only as agent for others who operate such services and all persons accepting or using tickets or authorizations in any form for such services shall thereby be deemed to agree and consent that the Carrier shall not be or become liable for any act or omission pertaining to such services or for any loss, injury or damage to any person or property arising there from or in connection therewith.

#### Personal Possessions

Personal articles such as coats, cameras, handbags, etc., are the guest's responsibility. Do not leave your possessions unattended at any time.

Shore Excursions are operated by reputable local agencies and have been thoroughly checked by Celebrity Cruises for full interest and value. Shore Excursions are offered for sale by Celebrity Cruises as a convenience to our guests. While great care has been taken to offer the finest excursions available in each port, these tour services are provided by independent tour operators and Celebrity Cruises will not be responsible or liable for any loss, damage, injury, costs or delays resulting from, or in connection with, your use of these services. Celebrity Cruises acts only as the agent of the supplier of these services and does so on the express condition that no liability of any kind, howsoever caused, shall attach to Celebrity Cruises or its agents, servants or employees in connection with or arising there from.

All tickets, coupons, and vouchers issued by Celebrity Cruises for Shore Excursion arrangements made on behalf of guests are expressly subject to the terms and conditions of the person or company providing such transportation facilities ashore.

## Refunds of Prepaid Excursions

Any refund request of prepaid excursions received by Celebrity Cruises 10 days prior to sailing will be made in full (unless noted otherwise). Refund requests made on board after the Shore Excursion Office closes ticket sales for that particular port will not be accommodated.

Tours purchased on board may be refunded at any time prior to the Shore Excursion Office closing ticket sales for that particular port. Refund requests made on board after the Shore Excursion Office closes ticket sales for that particular port will not be accommodated. If notice of cancellation is received after closing date and hour, a refund can be assured only in the event of the ticket being resold.

Closing times will be published in the Daily Program. No refunds will be made for failure to use all of the described services included in the tour price. Should any tour have to be abandoned due to difficulties en route, the best possible refund will be arranged according to the circumstances. Please note that tour lengths noted in this brochure are approximate.

No refunds are made to any guest who might cancel, deviate, leave, or otherwise not utilize all of the services scheduled to be provided by an excursion. Members of any excursion who elect to leave the automobiles or motor coaches, in the shopping area, or elsewhere, must provide their own transportation at their own expense back to the landing place of the vessel. Should any such excursion, however, be abandoned through force majeure the best possible refunds will be arranged according to the circumstances.

## Mild



To fully participate may require leisurely walking over primarily even surfaces. There may be a limited number of steps, a minimal amount of cobblestones or uneven surfaces, and some standing for extended periods of time.

#### Moderate



To fully participate may require extended periods of walking over even and uneven surfaces, steep terrain and/or water activity in a slight current. There may be steps, inclines, cobblestone surfaces, and extended periods of standing. Participants with physical limitations should take this into account.

#### Strenuous



To fully participate may require extended periods of physical exertion, extensive walking, climbing, or biking. There may be numerous steps, inclines, cobblestones, and other rough terrain throughout the excursion. These excursions are the most active and have been designed for participants in excellent health and very good physical condition.

## Dress Code



Conservative attire is recommended when going ashore on this tour. No exposed shoulders or knees. Short pants and tank tops are not acceptable.

## Family Friendly



These tours may be suitable for families with young children. Age restrictions may apply.

## Headsets



This tour utilizes an audio system that provides guests with headset units to use during the course portion of the tour. These units will assist the users with hearing the narration provided by the guides. Units are to be returned at the conclusion of the tour program.



## Light Snack / Refreshment



If a light snack or refreshment is served on an excursion, it will be designated with this symbol.

#### Meals



Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. If a meal is served on an excursion, it will be designated with this symbol.



For guests who are full-time wheelchair users. Guests may remain in their wheelchair or scooter for the duration of the excursion. Wheelchair or scooter dimensions are required in order to confirm excursion. Contact shorexaccess@rccl.com for assistance.

## Shopping



Time permitting, limited shopping is available during the tour.

## Waiver



All participants on this tour are required to complete a waiver and/or release form. This document will be distributed by the tour operator prior to commencing the tour.

Must Transfer from Wheelchair



For guests who use collapsible wheelchairs or scooters. Guests must transfer from their wheelchair or scooter to board the motorcoach, usually 2 or 3 steps. Guests should be self-sufficient. If assistance is required, guests should travel with a companion.



## **Terms and Conditions**

#### Reservations / Cancellations

Shore Excursions are available for purchase once you are aboard the ship and en route to your destinations except where otherwise noted, within the deadline advertised in the ships daily program. Very shortly after each closing time and date, final confirmations are sent from the ship to the Agencies concerned informing them of the definite and final requirements for meals, seats, number of automobiles and motor coaches, etc. If notice of cancellation is received after closing date and hour, a refund can be assured only in the event of the ticket being resold. However, in the event of any of the shore excursions having to be canceled, full refund will be made and upon tendering of same Celebrity Cruises shall be free of all liability in respect thereof. The closing dates and hours for all tours will be announced in the daily issue of the ships program.

## Cancellations and Refunds of Overnight Excursions and Flightseeing Tours

Overnight Excursions and Flightseeing tours may be canceled and the full tour price refunded at any time up to 30 days prior to the sailing date of the cruise. A 10% cancellation fee will be applied to all cancellations made from 30 days to 15 days prior to the sailing date of the cruise. Due to the booking requirements in the countries visited, no cancellations or changes may be made within 14 days prior to the sailing date of the cruise, or on board the ship.

#### Cancellations

Shore Excursions are subject to cancellation or modification, depending on the number of guests participating. In the event of a tour cancellation or modification, the Shore Excursion Manager and/or staff will give advance notice. Certain tours have a minimum-booking requirement, or must be limited to a maximum number of participants. If the minimum number for participation is not achieved, the excursion will be cancelled. In this event, an alternative may be offered; otherwise, a full refund will be given.

#### Additional Information

>GUIDE SERVICES AND TRANSPORTATION EQUIPMENT: In certain interesting but off the beaten track places, professional guides are at a premium. The best available and obtainable guides of competence are engaged. It is exceptional for drivers of public hire vehicles to speak any language but their own. Transportation equipment used for the shore excursions is the best available in the ports of call. In some ports, it is not possible to obtain buses or taxis equipped with air conditioning or bus or taxis with air conditioning that meets North American standards.

When choosing a tour, please keep in mind that you are a visitor in a foreign country; some luxuries to which you are accustomed may not be available. To get the most out of your excursion, please notice, feel, experience, and enjoy the local cultures, conditions, and customs.

With the popularity of some ports of call, the excursion itineraries and order of the actual tour may be changed at the discretion of the local operator, with or without notice, in order to give the best service possible under the prevailing local conditions.

ENTRANCE FEES: Entrance fees to all museums and sites are included in the price of the respective shore excursions unless otherwise stated. Occasionally, a small extra charge is levied if photographs are taken, and this is not included.

NIGHT EXCURSIONS vary throughout the worlds cruise ports. Many hotels have international-type acts, others national dances or folklore shows. Some ports are renowned for nightlife while others are more conservative. We aim to take you to the most generally accepted shows, but do not expect to find Paris standards at every port of call. Check the charges before ordering extra refreshments, photographing, or recording.

WITHDRAWAL OF TOURS: The right is reserved to withdraw any tour, to limit membership in any tour, or to make alterations in the operation of any tour, which may be deemed advisable for the safety or convenience of guests.

ITINERARIES are expected to be operated as described in the brochure but the right is reserved to change or omit a place to be visited or the sequence of the tour, in accordance with conditions or circumstances prevailing at the time of tours, with or without

The capital of Norway since the 14th century, Oslo today is a modern, refreshing city that in spite of many major setbacks has over time simply evolved. 'Old Christiania' is where following a devastating fire in 1624 the Danish King Christian IV laid the foundations of a spacious new town under the protective shadow of Akershus Fortress.

A guided walk through the area, characterized by old customs and shipping houses and grand open plazas, takes you past many cozy cafés and art galleries that now reside in its historic buildings. They include Engebret's Café - one of the oldest restaurants in the city. It stands on a beautiful square that is a fine illustration of King Christian IV's quadrangular town planning. Pass the Museum of Contemporary Art in a building that formerly housed the head office of Norges Bank, the Astrup Fearnley Museum of Modern Art, the Old Military Hospital and Christiania's Old Concert Hall.

The city's pulsing vein is Karl Johans Gate. Originally designed in 1826 by the Royal architect H.D.F Linstow, it was widened some 30 years later and is today Oslo's answer to the Champs Elysées. Amongst the splendid monuments you see along this main thoroughfare are Norway's Parliament Building, University, National Theatre and magnificent Royal Palace. Arrive in the City Hall Square and visit the City Hall, decorated by some of Norway's most distinguished artists with motives of from Norwegian history, culture and working life. after the visit a short walk will take you to the grounds of Akershus Fortress.

This medieval castle that was once a royal residence dates from 1299. In 1592, it was developed into a fortress armed with cannons to protect the city from marauders during the periods of Danish and Swedish rule. the sites offers photo opportunities over the arbor. The hotel is beautifully situated at the end of Lake Jolster. After the meal, you will have time for a stroll through the village with its interesting handicrafts. The catastrophic fire in 1904 left the town in ashes. There were 10.000 homeless people after the fire that destroyed the whole centre. The city was rebuilt in Art Nouveau or Jugend Style with provisions and building materials from all over Europe.

You will experience the reconstructed city centre - full of colour and life! Pay attention to the many decorative details on the buildings. You will feel the close connection to the maritime life in Brosundet harbour area and the busy city life in the pedestrian area.

After having explored the city centre for approximately 2 hours the guide will walk with you back to the pier.

You'll join your coach at the pier in Alesund and drive through green scenery along Storfjorden. Your first stop will be at the medieval Stordal Church, known for its interior rose paintings and fresco decorations.

You'll continue to Liabygd and arrive at the village of Valldal, known for its strawberry production. You'll follow the valley towards Trollstigen (Path of the Trolls), passing the impressive Gudbrandsjuvet Gorge, measuring 16 feet wide and 80 feet deep with a foaming river at the bottom. At 2,500 feet above sea level, surrounded by dramatically shaped mountain peaks, you can enjoy the stunning views from the viewpoint.

You'll travel down Trollstigen (Path of the Trolls) by bus and wind through its 11 giant hairpin bends blasted out of the mountainside to Isterdalen Valley. You will cross the Stigfoss Waterfall with a drop of 585 feet and you'll see the needle-sharp peaks thrust their way 600 feet skywards.

You'll reach the bottom of the valley that is surrounded by captivating mountains with majestic names, such as The King, The Queen and The Bishop. The drive then takes you through lush vegetation to Andalsnes, a charming village, and further along the Romsdalsfjord. You follow the river up the Romsdalen valley to see the highest vertical mountain wall in Europe, the Troll Wall, at 1,500 feet high. Before 1965, no one believed that it was possible for a human being to climb the vertical face of the Troll Wall. In 1965, a Norwegian and an English climbing team proved otherwise. It took them 14 days to reach the top, climbing different routes. Since then various routes have been climbed, the routes are often given names after the first ascendants. You'll return to Alesund passing picturesque villages along the fjord.

Large landscape aquariums teem with ocean life from the Atlantic, with emphasis on the western regions. Enjoy watching the diver feeding the fish by hand in the large Atlantic Ocean tank.

Before returning to Alesund, you'll make a detour to Mount Aksla, overlooking the town and the surrounding islands.

The coastal town of Alesund is the commercial and industrial capital of the More and Romsdal district. The city has one of Norway's largest fishing harbours with a rich and lively history. The city was devastated by fire in 1904; however, Alesund is now one of the few Art Nouveau towns in the world with an atmosphere and distinct character valued by inhabitants and visitors alike.

The tour takes you from the harbour and through the Art Nouveau center of the town with its amazing decorations and colourful facades. You'll visit the Sunnmore Museum, an open air museum concentrating on Norwegian coastal culture. Spread out over an area of approximately 50 acres about 2.5 miles east of the town center, 50 well-preserved old buildings display various architectural styles and lifestyles from the Middle Age to the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. You'll also find the boat collection is of great interest. The old Sunnmore boats were considered to be the most seaworthy vessels on the Norwegian coast. They can be seen in the large exhibit hall at the museum pier. You can also see the beautiful Borgund Stone Church, with its oldest parts dating back to around 1250.

After your visit, you'll proceed to the Mount Aksla viewpoint. Not only is there a fascinating bird's eye view of the town, but also a magnificent view of the myriad of islands and soaring peaks of the Sunnmore Alps. There are 450 goats belonging to the farm as well as cows, sheep and Norwegian ponies. Enjoy samples of the various food produced on the farm (different goat cheeses, sweet fudges produced with goat milk).

Voss is a renowned ski center and a historic place with heritage sites dating back to the Middle Ages. After lunch you will have



time for a stroll in the interesting village, among things to see are: the Church of Voss built in 1271-77, the "Mosafinn Monument" a bronze relief, a memorial in honor of the master fiddler Ola Mosafinn (1828-1912). Then it is time to continue the journey, this time by bus. The first stop is the lovely Tvinde Waterfall, which cascades down the mountainside. You will stop for a short stroll at the Tvinde Waterfall to take a photo or just enjoy the wonderful scenery. Your return trip to Flam will take you across the mountains via the old snow road. This will take you high up into the mountains affording you spectacular panoramic views and a guarantee that you will see snow. There will be several stops along the way for photos.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.25 mile over even and gravel surfaces with a few steps. Due to the high altitude of this tour, it is advisable to dress warm and bring along a jacket or a sweater. Time permitting; guests will have approximately 15 minutes for browsing and shopping. While in Undredal, you will have an outside visit of Scandinavia's smallest stave church, built in 1147, before sampling the excellent goat cheeses and other specialties made in the village. Undredal is one of the few locations in Norway that still produce this Norwegian specialty in the old fashion way. In "Eldhuset" (the fire house), you will receive an introduction on both traditional goat cheese making and mountain dairy farming. You will also have time to stroll through this picturesque village where some goats will surely keep you company!

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 300 yards over gravel and paved surfaces with few steps.

Continuing along the wharf, you will proceed to the lower station of the Mt. Floibanen Funicular where you will board the funicular. During the 8-minute ride, you will travel to the top of Mount Floien, some 1,000 feet above sea level, enjoying the continually expanding view of the port and harbor below.

At the top of Mount Floien, you will walk along some of the many gravel paths above the city of Bergen. Your guide will escort you through the hilly woodlands and down to the idyllic Lake Skomakerdiket. Depending on weather conditions and visibility; your guide will lead you through some of the many back wood trails, possibly reaching Rundemannen. At approximately 1,800 feet, this is the mountain's highest point. A leisurely downhill walk will return you to the upper funicular station for your return to the city center and the ship.

Note: Participants will be required to climb approximately 800 feet over a total of 5 miles over varying terrain. A portion of the route will be uphill so guests should be in good physical condition. Low heeled, comfortable walking or hiking shoes and comfortable, loose clothing are recommended. Participants should be aware that there are certain inherent risks involved in any hiking excursion. The Hanseatic Museum is your next stop. It is situated at "Bryggen" in one, of the old well preserved wooden buildings in Bergen. The museum is furnished in the style of the 1700's to give an intimate picture of the life of the hanseatic merchant. After the visit, you may explore the city further on your own or go back to the ship.
